Throughout the years, the work carried out by various members of the NOVA BHRE has helped shape the laws and policies of **various countries** in Europe and in Africa and at the **European level** (with the recent adoption of the Corporate Sustainability Due Diligence Directive).

In addition, through awareness-raising and capacity building activities with companies, governments, and civil society organizations, the work of the NOVA BHRE is contributing to providing an in-depth knowledge of corporate sustainability.

In 2024, the NOVA BHRE has pursued and intensified its work in line with its mission to contribute to fostering **responsible and Sustainable business conduct** in Portugal, Europe and beyond that upholds **respect for human rights, decent work and environmental standards throughout global value chains**. In this way it aims to advance the UN Sustainable Development Goals which seek to realize the human rights of all.

These efforts were recognized and rewarded by **2 prizes** received by the Director of the NOVA BHRE in December 2024, at the NOVA Science & Innovation Day for the impact of her research and contribution to the field of Business and Human Rights, and in particular:

- an Honorary Mention at the Research Impact Narratives Challenge for the impact of her work on Business and Human Rights on key legislative and policy developments at national level in various European countries and in Africa, as well as at the European level.
- an **Award in the "Publications with Impact" Category**, rewarding the scientific publications with the highest Field-Weighted Citation Impact during the 2021-2023 for the Commentary that 2 members of the NOVA BHRE (Claire Bright and Céline da Graça Pires) wrote on Guiding Principle 18 of the UN Guiding Principles on Business and Human Rights on the identification and assessment of actual and potential adverse human rights risks.



Earlier this year, the NOVA BHRE was interviewed by the **Portuguese Journal Vida Judiciária**. In the <u>interview</u>, the NOVA BHRE explained its mission and the main pillars of its work. It also explored the various initiatives carried out by the centre, including its collaboration with companies in the implementation of human rights policies and due diligence processes on human rights and the environment. Finally, it highlighted the challenges and opportunities of embracing human rights in the business context, as well as the Centre's plans for future.



OUR ACTIVITIES REASERCH PROJECTS

The NOVA BHRE Centre has been actively involved various research projects, including:

- The development of the <u>European Model Clauses for Responsible</u> <u>Supply Chains</u> which are a set of model clauses designed to align with the EU Corporate Sustainability Due Diligence Directive (CSDDD), which were published in July of 2024. The clauses are the product of the European Working Group (EWG), which is composed primarily of European legal experts from practice and academia, including Claire Bright.
- A project for the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) with the support of the Japanese Government for which Claire Bright drafted a report and led capacity building sessions to help inform the Tunisian Working Group on Business and Human Rights created by the Tunisian Government for the development of its first NAP.
- The project <u>"Access to justice in the context of corporate abuses:</u> <u>litigation as a strategy of resistance and empowerment of victims</u> <u>(ACCJUSTEDH)</u>, founded by the International Catalan Institute for Peace (ICIP) that lasted between September 2023 and September 2024 and in which members of the NOVA BHRE participated under the supervision of Laura Iñigo Álvarez.
- A collaboration with the NGO *Caminhos de Infância* for the project <u>"End Child Labour Project"</u> which aims at raising awareness of citizens, consumers and companies around the issue of child labour in global supply chains and to promote responsible business practices. Maria Miguel Oliveira da Silva and Claire Bright were involved in this project.

Awareness-raising and capacity building activities

The NOVA BHRE has been active in **promoting awareness-raising and capacity building activities with companies, governments, and civil society organizations,** in order to providing a thorough understanding of the theory but also the practice of **corporate human rights and environmental due diligence.** The initiatives include, *inter alia*:

 Human Rights Due Diligence Training in Tunisia - in January 2024, Claire Bright and Anaïs Tobalgba delivered a two-day training sessions in Tunis on human rights due diligence to approximately 40 participants from two major public Tunisian companies: The Electricity and Gas Company, and the Tunisian Chemical Group as well as other public and private companies. The training sessions were notably opened by Director General of the Office of the Prime Minister, Nizar Ben Sghaier, as well as the Representative of the United Nations Development Programme, Celine Moyroud. The main objective of the trainings was to help Tunisian companies identify, prevent, mitigate and address their adverse human rights impacts and to raise awareness on the applicable legal framework. The training sessions were delivered in French. This activity was organised in the framework of a program coordinated by the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) with the support of the Government of Japan.

 Human Rights Due Diligence Training in Tunisia - In September 2024, Claire Bright led one-to-one sessions to follow-up on the previous training sessions delivered in Tunisia to companies in the public sector and discuss the progress made by the individual companies, the challenges encountered and the next steps in the implementation of their human rights due diligence processes. This activity was organised in the framework of a program coordinated by the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) with the support of the Government of Japan.



• E-Curso ESG Reporting and Due Diligence: edição em português

 the NOVA Centre on Business, Human Rights and the Environment (NOVA BHRE) and the NOVA Green Lab launched a Portuguese edition of the Course on ESG Reporting and Due Diligence which dived into the emerging requirements for companies to align their policies and strategies with ESG criteria in line with the expectations of investors and consumers. This course we delivered online between September and November 2024 under the coordination of Claire Bright, Lucila de Almeida and included the participation of Ana Santos Duarte and Céline da Graça Pires as speakers.

- Anaïs Tobalagba provided a training on "Human Right and Environmental Due Diligence: Evolution and Implications for European Companies" to lawyers at Sérvulo & Associados on 3rd December on behalf of NOVA University.
- <u>Training Course on Business and Human Rights hosted by the</u> <u>Geneva Human Rights Platform</u> - On the 5th of September 2024, Claire Bright delivered a training session on Human Rights Due Diligence in the framework of the course on Business and Human Rights, hosted by the Geneva Human Rights Platform and co-led by Anita Ramasastry and Tara Van Ho




